





- This allows SSF to engage directly with the relevant stakeholders and organizations. This is significant to refine the position and finally present a strong and coherent position to governments (9)



- For social movements it enables us to maximally utilise the financial resources to attend COFI and the Summit



16. Do you have recommendations of activities and initiatives that can support engagement and dialogue among SSF Summit participants prior to the next Summit, e.g. regional meetings, studies, webinars etc.?



- Organise regional meetings, studies, seminars and webinars on key topics to address and articulate interventions at the next meeting (38)
- Get more grassroots groups of fishers, fishing communities, governments, NGOs and regional organisations (7)
- A mini-summit on 2023 and/or locate regional summits to be held before the global summit and COFI (4)
- Country level meetings and reports (2)
- To involve the private sector and the seafood industry (1)
- Pre-summits during CSO consultation before FAO Regional Conferences (1)
- Promote change, using existing experiences, adjusting to local conditions, multiply communication channels for others to see as not all fishers and others read technical or scientific papers or can participate in international conferences. Provide more actions, projects for sustainable fisheries (1)

16. Do you have recommendations of activities and initiatives that can support engagement and dialogue among SSF Summit participants prior to the next Summit, e.g. regional meetings, studies, webinars etc.?



- Discussions/focus on issues around the narratives, policies and enforcement of IUU fishing and the detrimental impacts of SSF communities, given the dramatic increase in attention to IUU fishing and efforts to prevent and deter it (2)
- The Community Catch programme focuses on the SSF. A public announcement will be made soon (early 2023) and the programme will include regional centres for social science actors. Information will be available soon on www.communitycatch.org (1)
- The SSF summit should take place just before COFI to 1) emphasise the demand for improved participation of the SSF sector in decision-making processes (i.e. COFI), 2) reduce international crossings. However, this requires better preparation in order to inform COFI parties and stakeholders, advocate for specific policy demands and develop concrete collaborations (1)

- Prepare side events earlier and organise a regional workshop and consultation on the implementation of the
 resolutions taken at the last summit and COFI. A transparent and participatory process of elaboration of the ToR
 and agenda so that it really focuses on issues of interest or concern to SSF (14)
- More time and space for discussion. Less presentations, more workshops on specific topics or activities around co-development of ideas. . E.g. Give more time and voice to observer organisations and take their concerns into account, more meeting exclusively for Fisherfolk, see what can be done about the lack of Indigenous Peoples and Knowledge in the Blue Transformation (10)
- The meeting place was not the right and suitable place for this type of organization. Arrangement of a better
 meeting place where everyone may sit in the same meeting room, see the speakers and have a constant access
 to interpretation. Improve the methodology of sharing spaces and delineate the purpose and focus of the space
 (9)

- To have more perception of fisherman, young men and women of the fishing communities, regional SSF organisations (E.G. RIPAPE) government and market/industry representatives (6)
- More time to prepare earlier announcements so we can easily secure visa and good accommodation/ transportation (2)
- All participants should be leaving at the same time if all have gone for the same time event (1)
- Better organisation of the free time, the possibility to stay together with persons of interest (1)
- Each country can provide a short report on the reality of artisanal fishing, the difficulties and the actions taken to solve them (1)
- Focusing more discussion and awareness on environmental aspects (1)
- Focus the discussion more on the implementation of marine development strategies and local development strategies (1)
- Include officials from other departments, nutrition, gender, value chains in the summit (1)

- It is necessary for FAO to certify that the representatives of small-scale fisheries to be invited are in fact representatives of the sector. Being nominated in some international body does not necessarily mean that this person knows the problems of fisheries. I noticed that some of the actors invited almost represented their governments or their entities and not the sector. Others were simply there and did not participate effectively or were not allowed to participate (1)
- Need to ensure a presence at the COFI plenary for each agenda item (1)
- Pay for the airfare and accommodation and meals only. That way you don't attract pseudo activists/opportunistic participants who are not from the fisheries sector and who are only doing workshop tourism. I had the opportunity to participate in the World Small-Scale Fisheries Congress workshop, and in addition it requires you to pay \$100 for the organisational fee, and I noticed a better level of participants and more important discussions than at the artisanal fisheries summit (1)
- Planning excursions and field trips (1)
- Select coastal areas and make visits to sites intended for artisanal fishing activities (1)
